

Thank you for your participation in the Housing and Community Development Department (H&CD) Fiscal Year 2000-01 federal and local funding process. The technical eligibility threshold review process conducted by staff determined that this project was ineligible based on the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) regulations. Consequently, your project was not forwarded to the Evaluation Committee for further consideration.

We noted your documentation showing that the Placentia Library District has an 11.19 percent poverty level within a three-mile radius of the Library. However, in order for this type of activity to be eligible it would need to meet the "area benefit" criterion showing that the entire area served is primarily low and moderate-income as defined by HUD. As your application indicates, all Library users would benefit from the Roof Replacement project. You also indicated that state confidentiality laws prohibit the Library from collecting economic status information on clients, which inhibits your ability to demonstrate the "area benefit" requirement. Therefore, your project can not substantiate its eligibility.

As provided by County of Orange/H&CD policy, you may appeal this determination. Appeals for any project funding recommendations must be submitted to this office in writing no later than February 2, 2000.

Allocation of District's Share of Electric Bill

BACKGROUND

Several years ago the City did an energy reduction program that included light fixture replacements and HVAC replacement.

The District is in the process of completing the same type of project. Part of the District's project included the installation of an electrical sub-meter to measure the amount of energy used in the Library. At the same time a sub-meter was installed on the common area lines that are provided through the Library's meter. The District now has several months of reading from these new sub-meters.

It was not economically feasible to set the District up on an independent electric meter for direct billing purposes because the lines run under the concrete and tile between our buildings.

However, for the first time it is now possible to accurately measure the District's share of the City's electrical Bill.

QUESTIONS TO BE ANSWERED

- 1. Is the City willing to consider breaking out the District's direct electric use as a separate item? A pro-rata share of the City's bill based upon the number of units actually used.
- 2. Who will set up the parameters for the reading of the sub-meters? The Library is willing to do this on the mutually agreed-upon date each month, and to also be responsible for delivering the reading information to the City Finance Department.
- 3. What will be the percentage for sharing the common areas?
- 4. Are the common area lines at City Hall now sub-metered? Who will be responsible for reading them on the agreed-up date? Would you like the District person to do all of the sub-meters, including the ones in City Hall?

- 5. Who needs to review these issues and our joint recommendations and to take action on them? What is the timetable?
- 6. What is the earliest date we can anticipate implementation if these changes are approved?

BACKGROUND

The Library Director is recommending that the Board develop and adopt a Retirement Recognition Policy so that the program is part of the District's compensation package. This will ensure equitable treatment for all employees eligible for the benefit.

The following statement is presented to initiate the Board's discussion.

Individuals who have been employed by the District for ten or more years, who are retiring at or after their eligible age as determined by the Social Security Administration, or who are retiring under Social Security Disability provisions, will receive a Retirement Recognition Award of \$75.00 per year of service with a maximum award of \$1,800.00. Individuals who have been working less than forty (40) hours per week will received a pro-rata share of \$75 per year for each year of service with a maximum award of \$1,800.00.

PRICE AND POPULATION DATA FOR LOCAL JURISDICTIONS

Appropriations Limit

Article XIII B of the California Constitution specifies that appropriations made by state and local governments may increase annually by a factor comprised of the change in population combined with either the change in California per capita personal income or the change in the local assessment roll due to local nonresidential construction.

The Department of Finance is mandated to provide the population and California per capita personal income change data for local jurisdictions to calculate their appropriations limits. The change in the local assessment roll due to local nonresidential construction may be obtained from your county Assessor. The enclosures contain the price factor and population percentage change for setting your 1998-99 appropriation limit.

Enclosure I provides the change in California's per capita personal income price factor. An example of how to utilize this price factor and the population percentage change in calculating your 1998-99 limit is included.

Enclosure II provides the population percentage change factors for cities and counties.

Enclosure IIA provides the population percentage change factor for counties and for the total incorporated population of each county.

These population percentage changes were prepared pursuant to Sections 2227 and 2228 of the Revenue and Taxation Code and are calculated as of January 1, 1998. Section 2227 specifies that state mental institutions, federal military bases and state and federal prisons be excluded from the percentage change calculations.

Population Factors for Special Districts

This letter may be received by special districts, which were exempt from establishing appropriation limits by Article XIII B, Section 9(c). Receipt of this letter should not be construed as a requirement by the Department of Finance to establish an appropriation limit.

Certification

The certification program applies to cities and counties only and does not apply to special districts.

Sections 11005.6 and 30462.1 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, Section 21022 Streets and Highways Code, and Section 38421 Vehicle Code specify that if a Department of Finance population estimate is greater than the current certified population, the Department shall automatically file a certified copy with the Controller not less than 25 days nor more than 30 days after completion of the estimate. The Department will certify the higher estimate unless a written request not to certify is received by the Department from the city or county within 25 days of the completion of the estimate. A city or county requesting that their higher estimate not be certified will remain at the current certified population.

The Department of Finance will not certify a population estimate that is lower than the current certified population unless requested to do so by a city or a county. The request for certification must be received by the Department on or before June 1, 1998.

PRICE AND POPULATION INFORMATION

Appropriations Limit

The Department of Finance is mandated to provide population and California per capita personal income change data to local jurisdictions to use in calculating their appropriations limits. The enclosures contain the official price factor and the population percentage change for setting your 1999-2000 appropriations limit. These data are effective for January 1, 1999, and were calculated on a base that excludes federal and state institutionalized populations and military populations as noted. Enclosure I provides the change in California's per capita personal income. An example of how to utilize this price factor and the population percentage change in calculating your 1999-2000 limit is included. Enclosures II and IIA provide population percentage change for cities and counties, and their incorporated areas.

Population Percentage Change for Special Districts

Some special districts are required to establish appropriations limits. These districts should consult the state code for the various population factors that may be used for purposes of assessing change in population. Other districts are exempt under Article XIII B, Section 9(c). This letter may be received by such special districts. However, it should not be construed as a Department of Finance requirement to establish an appropriations limit.

Population Certification

The certification program applies only to cities and counties. It is mandated that if a Department of Finance population estimate is greater than the current certified population, the Department shall automatically file a certified copy with the State Controller's Office not less than 25 days nor more than 30 days after completion of the estimate. The Department will certify the higher estimate unless a written request not to certify is received within 25 days of the completion of the estimate. A city or county requesting that its higher estimate not be certified will remain at the current certified population. The Department of Finance will not certify a population estimate that is lower than the current certified population unless requested to do so by a city or county in writing by June 1, 1999.

Community Out Reach- The community center visits to the library have continued. Response from the Gomez center and the Kathy Torrez learning center has been good. The Whitten center has not attended on either of its two scheduled visits. We are working with Eddie De La Torre at the City to try to get the Whitten center to take advantage of the visit days. In November there were 2 visits by community centers, with 32 children total attending.

Off-site bilingual programming at the Gomez and Whitten community centers began in November. Nancy Morey is the performer contracted for these performances. Nancy has conducted parenting classes at the community centers in the past, and so is a familiar face to Placentia parents. There were three performances in November with a total of 24 children enjoying stories, songs and puppets. As part of the program, paperback picture books are being given out to attending children in order to promote reading at home.

School Visits- Two classes visited the Library this month with a total of 71 students receiving a tour of the library and using its services.

Camp Library- November 19th saw the 13th annual Camp Library. The event went smoothly, and the program "Franklin Hayes Marionettes" was a big hit. Forty-eight parents and children attended the event; many were first timers to Camp Library. This year there were 2 teen volunteers who stayed the night to work the event. This helped a great deal with the set-up and the final clean-up.

Performing Arts- The El Dorado High School drama department once again performed their version of this years California Young Reader Medal Nominee picture books in their stage performance "From page to stage: stories to delight". There was an audience attendance of approximately 30 for this November 9th event.

NANCY SMITH ►Ms. Smith, who lives in Placentia, is a founding member of the Placentia Preserve Our Past committee, which is working to save an orange grove on the historic Brower Ranch property in the city.

t doesn't make much sense to deprive us, and all future generations, of all the culture and history surrounding the 3.6-acre orange grove and former home of the woman whose grandmother named our city "Placentia."

The family also named the street "Valencia" because it ran right smack-dab in the middle of their once 90-acre orchard.

They could have named the street after themselves, but chose to name it Valencia because not only was the Valencia orange their livelihood, but I would like to believe they chose to honor Placentia for creating the Valencia orange.

Doesn't it make sense to now honor them?

Don't worry about being taxed to gain the funds needed for the purchase of this property. The money is there; you've already paid for it.

And, if it doesn't get used this way, the city will find another use for it. Maintenance for the orange grove? The extra dollars you have been paying in the form of a utility tax will more than cover that.

If you think the proposed housing development for that site will be

At 99, former Marine feels 'ordinary'

PLACENTIA — Even at 99, he remains a Marine.

Every button must be shined. Each campaign ribbon must be pinned in order. And the starched white collar inside his dress blues must stand at attention.

Carl Buschena can't walk without help, can't hear without hearing aids, can't even pull on the old uniform by himself. But once it's on, his white crewcut practically bristles with military pride.

with military pride.
"I don't feel old," he said
Wednesday before being honored as oldest retired Marine
attending a countywide anniversary of the Marines' founding. "I feel like I'm just an
ordinary Marine."

ordinary Marine."

Buschena was one of 335 guests invited to the 224th Marine Corps Birthday Ball at the Irvine Marriott on Wednesday night — one of thousands of such balls around the nation this week.

"Getting ready for this is like getting ready for an inspection," said Buschena's daughter, Carlene Evans of Placentia. "We had to have all the tarnish off the (decorative collar) globes or we were going to have to go to Camp Pendleton to get new ones."

Buschena subdued a chuckle at all this attention.

The first time he donned a Marine uniform was 1921 Warren Harding was president—and by 1925 he'd established himself as a top biplane mechanic. These were the days of wooden planes, cloth

wings and open cockpits. Buschena was among the first to practice dropping bombs from them while critics scoffed at the idea of aerial bombing.

In 1925, two years before Lindbergh crossed the Atlantic, Buschena flew in a cross-country plane race that took so long that participants had to land their De Havilland DH4 in a cow pasture because they couldn't fly at night.

By the time World War II started, he was married and had been promoted to warrant officer.

Before going overseas, he was called to Orange County to help build a new Marine base to be called El Toro. He helped build two hangars before he

build two hangars before ne was shipped to China to oversee the upkeep of Corsair fighter planes during the war.

Buschena rubbed shoulders with history in 1945 when he was invited to the Japanese surrender in Tokyo Bay. He stayed in the same hotel as Gen. Douglas MacArthur and Adm. William Halsey just outside Tokyo. As the signing took place aboard the U.S.S. Missouri, Buschena watched over a crew of some 80 mechanics caring for about 30 U.S. planes ashore.

We could see the U.S.S. Missouri. We were glad it was over with," said Buschena.

He said he might've wanted a beer to celebrate, but drinking was not allowed.

Buschena still does his physical training each morning, though it's not like the old days. To demonstrate, he

grabbed his cane with both hands and raised it up to his face

"Lying down in bed," he said, "I can raise it up over my head."

He also kicks his legs to imitate walking each morning while sitting on his bed.

Today he'll do those exercises late because his plans were to be out past midnight.

"If I get a chance, I'll

sleep," he said of his Veterans Day celebration.

But after that, he will reflect on all those who shared his duty to country.

"I'll pray for all veterans," he said. "I'll say, 'God bless everyone that has ever been in the service, or has been shot at, or been wounded, or that has lost their lives for their country.' I would say they need a prayer to be taken care of."

Silverado celebrates library's 70th birthday

COMMUNITIES: For the close-knit canvon residents, the building is a place for friends to meet, play, and, oh, yeah, read.

SILVERADO CANYON -Anywhere else, there probably would've been a booming brass band, a fancy cake and maybe a government official on hand.

But not here. Not in closeknit Silverado Canyon, known for its very informal style.

Instead, kids, parents and other patrons walked, biked and skateboarded their way to the tiny one-room Silverado Library, which celebrated its 70th anniversary Saturday.

Inside, volunteers piled home-baked cookies, brownies and breads onto a table. Outside, couples danced while guitar players sang tunes by Bob Dylan and Roy Orbison.

"No, I haven't been here the whole 70 years," said the button worn by Lucille Cruz, Silverado's librarian of 21 years. "The kids keep asking me."

"But this is like my second home," said Cruz, who knows every patron by name. "And


it's much more than a library. ... It's a touchstone with the community."

This is where new mothers bring their babies to show them off, where friends chat, where patrons can play with the library's resident cat, Alise, a calico.

There's definitely "shushing" here. People are free to gab. On Saturdays, children grab books and settle into a corner to read and giggle, says Judy Dessel, a library volunteer. "This has such a nice country-home feel-

For young teens, the library, is somewhere to go, "when we get bored," says 13-year-old Dorothy Mutch.

It's got a computer with an Internet connection so they



can research and play. There are 15,000 books, magazines and videos to choose from compared with the 60 books the log-cabin library housed when it opened in 1929.

Kids can find stuff here that they can't get at school. "Our school has books that just have facts," says 12-year-old Josh Flegal. "Here I can get books about skateboards.'

The library, which serves about 1,200 area households, also is a place for adults to

gather in an emergency. During the 1987 Silverado fire, the library staff lived in the 1,000square-foot library room for three days, taking phone calls and updating residents.

"We are further out and isolated (more than most communities)," said Judy Myers, a 30-year canyon resident. "This little library connects

In 1995, residents almost lost the library, one of six Orange County branches facing closure in the wake of the bankruptcy.

At fund-raisers, residents paid \$20 for a cookie, said resident Sherry Meddick. "They'd say, 'Well, it's for the library," which was eventually spared.

The log cabin served as the library until 1946. The library later resided in a storeroom, then a barber shop, before settling in 1964 at its current site. _Brandy and Chad Burton,

Silverado natives, recently moved back to the canyon after a year in Orange because

they missed the closeness the community offers. "I'm just glad the library is still here so

she (4-month-old daughter Justice) can experience this Brandy Burton said.

Tailor board improvement efforts to your board's needs

Board selfappraisal is important poard Member Dagmar "Woody"
Murphy (Albany, NY) shares a good approach to an annual board self-evaluation.

Murphy says that in years when the board has been through a great deal of turnover, the board evaluates its performance using a comprehensive, long form. But in years when the board is a veteran, experienced group, it uses a short form approach to board self-evaluation.

"We've learned that when the board has several new members, we benefit from using the long form," says Murphy. "But when we've had little board turnover, in the interests of efficiency, we use the short form."

There's a good logic at work here. Asking the same group of board members to fill out the same form year after year will likely decrease the value of the exercise.

It's likely to become a quick fill-in-thecheck-boxes routine.

But by tailoring the board's approach to self-evaluation to the board's level of development and maturity, the evaluation is likely to remain fresh. It's more likely to receive the attention it deserves from board members.

"We just don't feel we can use the same form each year;" says Murphy. "Boards do change and people move on or take new positions."

How does the short evaluation differ

from the comprehensive one?

The short form is two pages in length and asks board members to rate 10 questions and provide comments on each question.

The long form is about ten pages long, and organized into seven categories such as board orientation, board/administrator relationship, policy and planning and board meetings. There are several questions to answer in each of these categories

Even though the short form evaluation is quicker to fill out, Murphy emphasizes the importance of including space on the form for board member comments. It gives board members a chance to register their views.

If you're interested in seeing a short form board self-evaluation, ask your administrator for the copy I included this month in *Board & Administrator* on page 8.

A thoughtful approach to tackling problems

here are times when boards, or their committees, struggle valiantly seeking a solution to a problem with little success. Often, their problem lies in a failure to correctly identify the problem, or lack of facts.

When this happens, tempers can flare and boards can become seriously divided. That's a waste of board time and effort.

Here's a process a Michigan board member says his board's committees use to arrive at the best possible solutions to the issues the board faces.

- "First, we always make sure we take a measured approach," he says.
 "We don't react too quickly by jumping to a quick conclusion."
- 2. Take time to find the facts, says this board member. "At this stage it's important to avoid bias. We just gather as much information as we can."
- 3. State the problem. With facts in hand, the board puts the problem down in writing. "If we can't state it clearly in writing, we haven't really identified the problem," he says.

4. At this point, the board lists any and all possible solutions to the problem.

"Understand that sometimes your best solution lies in a combination of solutions."

- 5. Consider each possible solution.
 - "Understand that sometimes your best solution lies in a combination of solutions. When we eliminate solutions, we look at criteria for each such as time, money, effort and legal issues," says the board member.
- 6. Pick your best solution. Select the one solution that matches your board's circumstances. Even if it's not the ideal solution, it may be the best the board can do.
- Write down your solution in a recommendation-to-the-board format. It should give the board clear guidance on what is needed to implement the solution.

Pass this bit of advice on to all board members

once asked a board member whom I respected what was the best piece of advice she had for people joining a nonprofit board for the first time.

Here's what she had to say: "Keep in mind that individual board members have no authority over the nonprofit or administrator. A board's authority comes from its collective action."

That's good advice for all of us to remember—veteran or newcomer to board service.

A Wyoming board believes the point is important enough to write it into its board code of conduct policy. Here's how the policy reads:

 "Board members are not to attempt to exercise individual authority over the organization.

- "Board members' interaction with the administrator or staff must recognize the lack of authority in any individual director or group of directors.
- "Board members' interaction with clients, the public or the press must recognize the same limitation, as well as the inability of any single board member to speak for the board.
- "Board members are not to make judgments of the administrator's or staff performance except in the context of official board policy on executive performance."

Is this board policy one that your board might want to consider? Take it up with your executive director. ■
