



Bennett's Bonus Request

Dear Pool Participant:

On November 10, 1999, United States District Court Judge Gary Taylor issued his decision regarding Hennigan, Mercer & Bennett's ("HMB") motion for additional attorneys' fees. As you will recall, the motion sought a \$49 million enhancement of the \$26 million in fees already received by HMB for its representation of our Litigation Representative, Tom Hayes. Judge Taylor denied the \$49 million enhancement and instead awarded HMB \$3 million in additional compensation.

Summarizing the decision, the opening paragraph states:

The Court finds the parties entered into a valid and binding attorney fee agreement for a fee based on fixed "benchmark" hourly billing rates, subject to adjustment down or up at the end of the representation based on results accomplished and other agreed criteria. Strictly construing the contract against the attorneys, the final fee is not calculated by a lodestar multiplier, but, in the absence of a specific agreement for a major adjustment, the final fee is appropriately in the same general order of magnitude as the hourly "benchmark" fee. The Court finds the appropriate contract fee is an additional fee of \$3 million.

The opinion addresses procedural issues which were raised by the parties through briefing and oral argument. The Court found, among other things, that it had jurisdiction over the fee dispute. that certain provisions of the Bankruptcy Code were inapplicable, that the Bankruptcy Court's

injunction was not violated by the lien filed against the litigation proceeds and that neither discovery nor a jury trial were required.

The Court further considered whether the Representative had sole discretion under the Plan to reject HMB's request for a fee enhancement and whether that discretion was retained under the fee agreement. The Court agreed that the Representative retained discretion under the Plan to hire HMB to pursue the Pool claims. The Court held, however, that once the Representative entered into the fee agreement, he was contractually bound by its terms and, under such terms, he did not have discretion to unilaterally reject HMB's fee request.

Construing the fee agreement, the Court strongly rebuked HMB's argument that a multiplier was necessary to assure that attorneys work diligently on their clients' cases. The Court also flatly rejected HMB's argument that application of a 2.85 multiplier to the fees it already received was an appropriate basis for HMB's final fee:

In this case, the parties' contract makes no mention of a multiplier. It gives no indication of the potential magnitude of difference between the hourly rate and the final fee that a multiplier would create. It merely provides the final fee will be based upon 'benchmark' hourly rates with possible adjustment.

... By using 'benchmark' to define the hourly rate, without any reference to a multiplier or huge magnitude leap to a final fee, the reasonable interpretation of the contract language is that the hourly rate is a rough approximation of what the final fee will be. The final fee may be adjusted based on other listed factors, but any differential would be fairly close to the hourly rate.

Judge Taylor examined the factors listed in the fee agreement to determine whether adjustment was appropriate. Briefly reviewing the history of the litigation, he held that the listed factors were all already accounted for "in the high hourly rates paid the Hennigan firm," except for the results achieved. Influenced by the fact that in its estimation the litigation recovered \$865 million of the net \$900 million losses suffered, the Court held that a \$3 million adjustment was appropriate.

I will advise you if there are any further developments regarding Judge Taylor's decision. Also, I will send you a letter regarding the final report and distribution schedules within the next 10 days. In the meantime, thank you again for your continued support of the Committee.





RE: CURRENT REPORT

The three History Room volunteers participated in the recent Orange County Historical Commission's annual conference at CSUF the weekend of October 23,24,25. Registration costs were covered by the Library's Afghan account. There was a delightful opening reception at the George Key Ranch on Friday evening, under the trees, with Chinese Latterns strung from branch to branch. Three individuals received Lifetime Achievement Awards - Opal Kissinger (well known for Fullerton history), Larry deGraaf (Placentia Historical Committee and Library History Room Committee) and Jim Sleeper (Orange County writer and historian). A monologist performed living history as Vicenta Sepulveda Yorba Carrillo.

"Building Bridges to Orange County History" was the theme of the conference and our Saturday presentation highlighted the bridges we have built here in Placentia, emphasizing, in addition to its local history concentration, the role of the Trustees in creating a liaison between and among history groups in the city. Attendees were impressed with the city and library's relationship.

One of our future goals for the History Room is to collaborate with the other groups in the city to develop a community education package; nothing is formalized as yet but there is an interest from the Bradford House and the Historical Committee with George Key Ranch still to be approached. This package as conceived would not only have a fully developed Third Grade School package but additionally would consider how to educate all community members. Target date would be the city's 75th anniversary in 2001. A session presented at the conference provided materials relating to Orange County history in general which can be included.

As a demonstration of "building our local bridges", the Bradford House has a current display on Isadora Brower realia, which is on loan from the Placentia History Room. It was available for the conference and continues to be beautifully displayed at this writing. We have a good working relationship with the current curator there.

We have some other ideas under consideration which are worthy but it is a question of available time. For instance, we would like to use the library's display cases for historical displays related to current city activities - such as "Miss Placentia"

Through the Years" when the Chamber holds its search for a new Miss P.

The Orange County Register is providing monthly a supplemental magazine which relates to county history. The first publication has an article about Placentia's flood as related by Eddie Castro. It also mentions in one article the origin in 1910 of Nickey Petroleum, soon to be a Placentia business moving in from Santa Ana. Of broader scope - and interest - the L.A.Times has a weekly report called "Stories that Span the Century" which often has local implications.

We continue to organize and file primary and secondary historical print materials. They are organized first from their sources, which at this time are five collections - Carpenter, Kraemer, Aguirre, Brower, Library - and secondarily, by the subject. Beyond donations to us such as the Brower materials, the newspaper daily generates something to be added to the Library collection.

We are creating a file of articles on segments of local history to be used from time to time in the Newsletter and on the Website.

The Preserve our Past activity has generated calls from the local newspapers for information which we have been able to supply - even photographs.

The History Room enlargement project is scheduled soon for the Planning Department to draw proper plans with which to go out to bid. Our proposal did include furnishings and equipment; it is the computer capability for which we are so needy. Our computer processes so slowly - so if you hear of equipment which might be better, keep us in mind.

Placentia Library District is scheduled to receive \$88,450 (\$1.68476 per capita) for Fiscal Year 1999-2000. The allocation, if PLF had been fully funded, would have been approximately \$105,000.

CERTIFICATION TO RECEIVE FUNDS FROM THE PUBLIC LIBRARY FUND, 1999-00.

I know you share my pleasure and gratitude at the final approval of \$18 million added to the Public Library Foundation Program this year. This augmentation brings the funding of the PLF from the current level of \$38,870,000 to \$56,870,000. The augmentation continues to be tied to the implementation of a per capita distribution method to determine Public Library Fund allocations. AB 345-Granlund, Chapter 167 of the Statutes of 1997, is the legislation that changes the Public Library Fund allocations from a formula based on local per capita appropriations to a formula based solely on the population of the library's service area. AB 345-Granlund does not impact the local maintenance of effort requirement for eligibility for distribution of funds.

California law requires fiscal officers to report certain library appropriation information as set forth in the enclosed certification form. This letter serves to notify you of this year's request for certification. This information is required to establish libraries' eligibility to receive funds under this law. In particular, note the "definitions" quoted from the law on the second page of the Annual Certification form. Refer to the definitions, section (c), in order to properly fill out the attached "Signature Authorization Form." For example, a "Fiscal Officer" means, for a municipal library, the chief fiscal officer of the municipality... Please return this form along with your signed certification by the *December 1, 1999* due date.

Note that "appropriation," not "expenditure," is called for in the law. The final date for this year's certification is *December 1, 1999*. Only library jurisdictions certifying a figure by *December 1, 1999*, will be eligible to participate in Public Library Fund allocations this year. Education Code Section 18025(d) establishes the maintenance of effort requirements for eligibility to receive PLF funds at 100% of the amount appropriated in the prior fiscal year.

Also note a second form to be used by libraries that wish to request a waiver of the maintenance of effort requirements. Waivers of the maintenance of effort requirement have previously been granted based on revenue declines related to the property tax shifts of 1992-93 and 1993-94, Section 18025(e)(1-2). The Governor also approved legislation (SB 1100-Solis) which allows libraries to submit requests to waive the maintenance of effort requirement based on budget reductions as a result of the addition of Article XIIID, otherwise known as the Right to Vote on Taxes Act, to the California Constitution, Section 18025(e)(3).

Submission of a waiver request based on the property tax shifts does not preclude the submission of a waiver request based on the impact of the Right to Vote on Taxes Act. I suggest that fiscal officers and library director's work together with California State Library staff in completing the waiver forms. It is our intent to be as supportive as possible in helping you develop your justification for a waiver request.

Libraries failing to file their certification and waiver request, if needed, by December 1, 1999, must, by law, be deemed ineligible to receive funds for 1999-00. A postmark of December 1, 1999, or earlier will fulfill this requirement. If you are uncertain about complying with this deadline, I urge you to consider using a delivery service, hand-carry the forms to the State Library office, or use another mailing service as noted on Attachment B. Use of post office special services such as registered mail will help preclude any doubt regarding the postmark.

ARTICLE 2. DEFINITIONS

Section 18015. Definitions.

As used in this chapter:

- a) "Public library" means a library, or two or more libraries, operated as a single entity by one or more public jurisdictions and which serve the general public without distinction.

In the case of a public library which provides foundation program service by contract to one or more jurisdictions in addition to the jurisdiction or jurisdictions with which it is affiliated, the chief fiscal officer of the jurisdiction with which it is primarily affiliated shall be deemed the fiscal officer for the public library for the purposes of this chapter.

I am please to submit to you Placentia Library District's CDBG application in the amount of \$55,000 entitled *Roof Replacement for Placentia Library*.

Like the County of Orange, Placentia Library District was forced to defer many facilities maintenance issues during the years immediately following the Orange County Bankruptcy. During the past year many of these issues have been addressed by the District:

A seismic retrofit program is underway under the leadership the City of Placentia. The District's cost is approximately \$15,000.
The District is in the middle of the construction phase of a lighting and HVAC retrofit project for energy conservation which involves a fourteen (14)-year contract for \$289,535, including capitalized interest.
The District is currently seeking Foundation support for re-upholstery and flooring projects.

The roof replacement project is critical to maintaining the structural integrity of the Library. Other than the roof and cosmetic issues like paining and flooring, the Library is in excellent overall condition and is of an adequate size to serve the District for the life of the new roof – there are no long-term plans for building expansion.

I hope that our proposal will match the County's CDBG program for this year and that it will be able to fund the Placentia Library Roof Replacement.



1. Need for the project

A. Why is the project needed? What evidence can you cite for this need?


The Placentia Library Roof Replacement Project is needed because the roof that was installed when the Library was constructed in 1974 has deteriorated over time to the point that it has numerous areas around its perimeter and interior where it leaks significantly. In 1997 the leaks began to occur in the areas immediately over the book stacks, risking significant damage to the collection.



While the early damage primarily impacted the perimeter of the Library, in recent years it has involved the areas over the book stacks in the Adult Non-fiction shelving. It has also caused damage along several of the interior walls.



The perimeter areas have sustained the most severe damage. Through the absent ceiling tiles one can see the potential damage to conduits and HVAC materials.



Patch repairs were completed in 1997 and 1998 with the recommendation from the City Public Works staff and the licensed roofer that a replacement roof is critically needed.

The licensed roofer who completed the most recent inspection in May 1999 reported that:

Additional temporary repairs would not be cost effective

A perimeter repair would provide relief for a maximum of five (5) years on the perimeter leaking only

The Library would still need to do a total roof replacement to address the issue of the interior roof leaks

B. What problem or deficiency in public facilities will it address?

The problem that will be addressed is elimination of the multiple leaks in the public service areas of Placentia Library. When it is raining several areas of the book stacks need to be closed in order to ensure public safety.

2. Quantifiable Performance Measures

A. What benefits will be achieved by construction of the project?

Reduction by 100% of the number of books damaged by water from leaks over the book stacks.

Library patrons will have access to all of the books stacks when it is raining.


The Library will avoid leak-related damage to its ceiling-located wiring conduits and HVAC system.

B. Who will benefit from this project? Please provide census track and block group information.

All users of Placentia Library, including residents of the District and other individuals from throughout Orange County and California, will benefit from the roof replacement project.

Placentia Library District serves an area basically contiguous with the perimeter of the City of Placentia but it has approximately 3,000 more population because it includes the unincorporated islands within the City of Placentia.


The following is a map of Placentia Library District as provided by the County of Orange in 1990.



The State Librarian of California certified on June 1, 1999 a population of 52,500 for Placentia Library District for use in Fiscal Year 1999-2000.


In 1998 the Gates Library Initiative identified Placentia Library District as having a 11.19% poverty level in the area within a three (3) mile radius of the Library facility. This qualified the District as one of only four (4) Library facilities in Orange County to receive a Gates Equipment Grant in Fiscal Year 1999-2000.

C. How many persons will benefit from this project? What percentage of these persons is low- and moderate-income?

All Placentia Library users, whether or not they are registered borrowers, will benefit from the Placentia Library Roof Replacement Project.

In Fiscal Year 1998-1999 309,822 individuals used Placentia Library. During that period there were 27,895 registered borrowers. 38.64% of the items circulated by the Library were used by borrowers who lived outside the District. D. Describe how the project will help preserve a low- and moderate-income neighborhood, or provide other community benefits.

Since the Library facility is located in an area with an 11.19% SPOV it is important to maintain the public facilities in this neighborhood so that the residents feel safe and comfortable in the facility and have a public building that they are proud to have in their neighborhood.

- 3. Project Process/Feasibility/Timeliness
 - A. Describe support for the project by the affected persons and the surrounding community.

The condition of the roof is not apparent to Library users unless it is actually raining. At those times people constantly comment on the need for a major repair to the building.

B. How will those affected by the project participate in its implementation?

There will be no public participation in the implementation of the roof replacement.

C. Explain how the project will provide for safety and, if applicable, handicap accessibility.

The Placentia Library Roof Replacement Project will not impact handicap accessibility for the Library.

The safety issues address include elimination of ceiling tiles falling because of accumulated moisture, access to books in areas closed because the stacks are covered with plastic when it is raining, and potential problems with ceiling conduit.

D. Describe your planned schedule for project implementation and completion. Provide estimated dates for each milestone completed.

The project will be set for bid as soon as the grant is awarded. The roof replacement work will be done in May or June, as soon as the rainy season is over.

E. Are there any foreseeable difficulties in obtaining the project site, right-of-way or rights of entry? List the property owners or others who must approve.

Placentia Library District owns Placentia Library and is the only agency that must approve of the roof replacement.

All applicable City building permits and inspections will be required and included in the project. The City has agreed to provide the permits and inspections without charge to the District.

The roofing inspector stated in May 1999 that there are no known adverse environmental impacts related to this project.

The Library District will absorb all costs over the \$55,000 estimate provided by the roofing company.

The Library Director has worked with two (2) construction and remodeling projects in her career: a remodeling project, including a roof replacement, in Hungington County, PA, and a combination new facility and Carnegie building restoration, including installation of a flat roof on the new building, in Dubuque, IA.

HISTORY: Revived conference will open today and run through Sunday.

An army of 50,000 Boy Scouts pummeled their tent stakes into prime Newport Beach real estate in July 1953, ready for a week of fun, trading alligator skins and watching performers like Debbie Reynolds.

But then-Vice President Richard Nixon and other adults saw them as something

adults saw them as something more: a spirited army of youth ready to help fight the Cold War, Cypress College historian Henry Koerper will contend

at Saturday's revived Orange County History Conference "It was a battle for the young minds of America," said Koerper, one of dozens of local historians taking a fresh look at the past this weekend at the conference, themed as "Building Bridges to Orange County History."

"You had Vice President Richard Nixon comparing our fine youth with the 'contemptuous' and 'arrogant' Soviet youth," Koerper said. "On Sunday he went from church service to church service to show that our youth believed in God. It was all quite political."

Local historians, librarians and others will view Orange County history from many angles — from the ethnic diversity of its early immigrants to finding the best local history sites on the Internet.

The conference opens with a

free reception at 5:30 p.m. today at the George Key Ranch in Placentia. Opal Kissinger, a retired librarian who some know from her living history performance of actress Helena Modjeska, takes on a new role: Vicenta Sepulveda Yorba Carillo, a 19th-century county woman with ties to the Sepulvedas, Yorbas and Carillos, who left their mark on Orange County.

Presentations will be made all day Saturday at California State University, Fullerton. On Sunday, the affair spreads to many historical sites around the county. Thirteen local historical societies, museums and other groups will host special events and tours.

"With all the millennium stuff that's coming out now, it's a perfect time to bring the conference back," said Art Hansen, a Cal State Fullerton history professor who worked with history teacher Barbara Milkovich to breathe new life into the conference, previously held at Chapman University.

Some sessions deal with new ways of researching local history, such as the Internet.

Other presenters will look at the space-age Googie architecture that decorated the county in the 1950s, and the county's business history. You can explore the latter from an Internet Web site: www.chapman .edusbe/oc.bus.his.

Historian John Sorenson.

who pored over reams of census and other data, will challenge nostalgic notions of the "good old days."

"A lot of people are very romantically imbued with the past, when orange groves covered the county," he said. "But how many people would go back to working all day in the packinghouse for a few pennies or dollars? To a day when the average individual had 61 cents a week for eating out and entertainment. And when unemployment stayed at about 13 percent for 12 years?"

INAPPROPRIATE USES

Mission Viejo is the latest city to deal with Internet-borne pornography in its library. County libraries prepare filter.


ome people callit a right. Some call it an art. And some call it smut. The Mission Viejo Library and libraries across the country call it a dilemma.

The dilemma — how to preserve a valuable information tool, the Internet, and protect children from its darker side — is now being considered by the Mission Viejo City Council.

The council delayed a decision Monday to install filters on its library computers, despite the proposal's strong support from parents attending the meeting.

The council agreed unanimously to study the problem further and return to council Dec. 6 for further debate.

Councilman John Paul edesma, the author of the

proposal, said that he was not surprised by the decision to delay acting on installing filters.

"A little bit of progress is better than nothing," he said.

The council will research costs, program effectiveness and legal ramifications.

Two council members remarked that they use the Internet daily and they have never accidentally opened a porn page.

Mayor Sherri Butterfield said the city does not want to be in the position to do what parents should do.

"Filters are not foolproof. Pornagraphers work 24/7 to defeat the filter process and at some point filtered computers will no longer be safe. If we put filters on a computer, parents will assume their child is safe, which is not true," Butterfield said.

Open comments brought at least 10 people to the podium to speak in support of the proposal

Councilman William Craycraft said that no council member in any way supports pornography but suggested to one speaker that nightly television had untold pornography. Craycraft asked the speaker if he had any suggestions on how to control it on television.

The speaker said that the city council has no control over the content of television but it does have control over the content of the library's Internet.

"We don't let our children play on the freeway, or plan with weapons or even eat anything they choose, you and I are accountable to the children," said Matt Corrigan.

Libraries across the country are wrangling with the problem. The American Library Association states that about 14 percent of the libraries have resorted to filters.

Councilman Craycraft holding a copy of the Orange County public library policy said that the city's policy is similar to the

Starting January, the Orange County public library begins filtering the children's library computers according to children's librarian, Lynn Eisenhut.

"The Orange County Board of Supervisors recommended filtering children's computers out of concern for child safety," she said.

The Orange County Department of Education filters the Internet for districts like the Saddleback Valley Unified School District.

OCDE representative Norm Neville said filtering programs accurately screen about 90 percent of the offending websites but is time-consuming to maintain.

"The programs also allow for manual requests of sites by address and keyword," Nevel said.

Mission Viejo Librarian Valerie Meyer said the Library's current policy is working and the additional controls are unnecessary.

"The City Council, city staff and library staff worked for two years developing our policy," she said, "And we believe the most powerful tool we have is parental control. A parent must give permission to use the computer and be aware that their child is using it and then our staff provides direction," she said.

Councilwoman Susan Withrow suggested adding stronger wording in the library policy so parents are better informed of the inadvertant dangers of the Internet.

Mission Viejo's current policy toward inappropriate computer use is to admonish the patron and cancel library privileges for three months.

Councilman Ledesma said punishment is not prevention.

Meyer said that of 72,000 hours logged on library computers in two years only 10 documented cases of misuse is known

"Inappropriate use is not a problem at Mission Viejo Library," she stated.

Mission Viejo is a city library and unemcumbered by county restrictions. Several south county libraries including Aliso Viejo, Rancho Santa Margarita, Lake Forest and the planned Foothill Ranch branches are all a part of Orange County library system.

The county children's librarian. Eisenhut, said the county's Internet policy states that any behavior that is disruptive to other patrons using the library will not be tolerated. Its policy states that patrons may not display text or graphics offensive to staff or other other patrons. Anyone found accessing such material will be asked to leave and their Internet privileges will be suspended for three months. In addition, parents of minors will be notified.

Any other disruption at the library is treated in the same manner.
