In Bram Stoker's Gothic horror novel titled *Dracula*, we follow Count Dracula as he aims to move from Transylvania to England in order to spread his undead curse and find new blood. The story opens with Jonathan Harker, an English solicitor who is assisting Count Dracula with a real estate purchase in England. As the story progresses the audience as well as the characters figure out that Dracula is something other than human.
