Celebrating National Library Week and an Exciting New Chapter



It is with deep gratitude and heartfelt remembrance that we honor the lives and legacies Ginny Sanatar and Norman Haussman, two extraordinary individuals whose generosity and commitment to our library have left a lasting impact.



Ginny Sanatar was a steadfast advocate for literacy and lifelong learning, supporting countless library programs that enriched our community. Ginny was an avid reader of mysteries and introduced the sci-fi adventure reading genre to her late husband, Pat. A longtime Orange County resident and active member of the Placentia Library Friends Foundation, Ginny joined the Placentia Library Friends Foundation board in 2001 and was elected to the position of financial secretary in 2002, a role she continued to serve through 2018. She also served as Author's Luncheon chairwoman in 2014. Ginny was well respected and lovingly admired for her dedication to the Placentia Library District and touched many lives through her smiles and warmth. Ginny passed away on January 2, 2025.



Norman Hausmann and his late wife, Virginia, believed in the power of books to inspire and transform lives. Through their generous contributions, the Placentia Library District was able to continue to provide excellent programs and learning opportunities more accessible to all who walked through our doors. Norman lived in Placentia since 1975 until he and Virginia moved to Kissimmee, Florida in 2015. Virginia was an active member of the Placentia Library Friends Foundation and served as a member of the PLFF board starting in 2007. Norman generously donated \$20,000, in honor of Virginia's memory, toward the Placentia Library District's renovation. The Virginia and Norman Haussmann Storytime Alcove honors them both. He is also honored on the Placentia Veterans Monument located in the Placentia Civic Center for his naval service. Norman passed away on November 28, 2024.
