

1. GUTTERS

Don Miller (formerly Architectural Sheet Metal) of Anaheim cleaned and sealed the gutters on the west side of the Library, and installed two new downspouts and collectors. They have yet to be tested by rain.

2. PUBLIC PRINTER

Hasps and locks have been installed on the printer connected to the public computer. Problems were occurring when users opened the top of the printer to try see if they could find out why it was not printing. Because they were not familiar with the printer, it often was rendered inoperative. Staff time was required to sort things out. Since we have locked the top of the printer, we have had no further problems.

3. **RESTROOMS**

All toilets in the building have been routed as a preventative measure. The flow of one the faucets in the public women's restroom has been adjusted.

Several tiles near the check-out area required regrouting.

5. FRIENDS ROOM


The old shelving has been removed and taken to the Whitten Center where it will be used by Families for Literacy.

3. Training

Overall objectives: Train 120 new tutors in learner centered approach of teaching basic skills; train a minimum of 15 other volunteers to assist in implementation of program goals during FY 1992-93.

- B. Conduct Workshop Leader's Training in March.

4. Matching

GRANT AGREEMENT

for all planning and mini-grant projects funded by the California Council for the Humanities

Date: January 25, 1993

Grant Number: G93M-195

Between the California Council for the Humanities (hereinafter, CCH) and:

Placentia Library District (hereinafter, Grantee) for the project entitled:

Longing for Community: Dream or Nightmare? described in Grantee's proposal to the CCH, dated:

December 28, 1992

Upon receipt of a signed copy of the CCH grant award letter, the CCH will provide a grant to the Grantee subject to the terms and conditions set "th below."

1. GRANT PAYMENT

Upon receipt of the grant award letter from the CCH office, the project director must sign and return the copy of the letter acknowledging acceptance of the grant award and the provisions outlined in this Agreement. A check for the full amount of the grant award will be sent upon receipt by the CCH of the signed copy of the grant award letter.

2. LIMITATIONS ON THE USE OF GRANT FUNDS

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1965 provides that "no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance." (Section 601) Grantee's activities will be subject to review to determine whether Grantee is meeting the requirements of Title VI and is eligible to continue to receive such federal assistance.

Grant funds may be expended only for project purposes and activities set forth in the budget as originally approved or subsequently amended. Proposed amendments must be submitted by the Grantee for written approval by the CCH. Significant changes requiring such action include the following:

a. Changes in the project director or other key professional personnel identified in the approved application. A change in the project director brings an automatic suspension of the grant until the new director has been specifically approved by the CCH.

- b. Changes of project scope, purpose, or activities.
- c. Changes in the project budget which exceed 20 percent in any budget line item or which introduce or eliminate types or categories of expenditures.
- d. Changes in duration of the grant period. (Changes should be requested at least 30 days prior to the termination of the grant period.)

The grant period begins on the date of the award letter and terminates six months later. Commitment of grant funds must occur during the grant period. Such commitments must relate to goods or services provided and used within the grant period.

The total payment by the CCH to the Grantee will not exceed the amount set forth in the original grant award letter or written modification thereof.

3. MISAPPLIED FUNDS

In cases where funds are determined by the CCH to have been misapplied by Grantee, Grantee agrees to repay to the CCH all such funds or transfer to the CCH all property acquired through the use of such funds.

4. UNCOMMITTED FUNDS

Any funds actually received by Grantee which remain uncommitted at the termination of the grant period must be returned by check payable to the California Council for the Humanities, at the time of submitting the final financial report.

5. COST PRINCIPLES

Only those costs set forth in the approved project budget are allowable. The following list of such special items is not intended to be a comprehensive statement of all nonallowable costs. In the event of a conflict between the general standard below and any special provisions in the grant award letter, the special provisions shall be applicable and binding.

- a. Per Diem Reimbursements. Costs may not exceed the current rates allowable by the CCH and may be for lesser amounts at the Grantee's discretion.
- b. Travel Reimbursements. Whenever possible, less than first class accommodations should be used for air or rail travel. If first class accommodations are used, records should contain a certification that less than first class accommodations were not available. When necessary, travel by other than the above modes may be authorized. The maximum automobile mileage reimbursement rate is that currently authorized by the CCH.
- c. Capital Items. Capital items include land, buildings, automotive equipment, office equipment, electronic equipment, etc. THE PURCHASE OF ANY ITEM WITH GRANT FUNDS REQUIRES PRIOR WRITTEN APPROVAL BY THE CCH.
- d. Food Costs. Food costs for luncheons, banquets; coffee, or any other purpose, other than per diem reimbursements for project personnel in travel status, are unallowable.

GRANT ACCOUNTING AND RECORDS

- a. General. Grantee shall maintain records and accounts consistent with generally accepted accounting principles and also shall provide for such fiscal control and fund accounting procedures as are necessary to assure proper disbursement of and accounting for grant project funds. Accounts and supporting documentation relating to project expenditures shall be adequate to permit an accurate and expeditious audit.
- b. Matching Funds. Grantee shall maintain records to demonstrate that matching contributions are not less than the amount proposed in the application or any subsequent revision thereof. The amount of Grantee's contribution is subject to audit.
- c. In-Kind Contributions. Some objective record as to both type and value of in-kind contributions by Grantee (such as signed in-kind contribution statements) is required. When the contribution is made by a third party, written evidence from the third party is required as to both type and value.

7. REPORTS

Grantee shall submit, by the end-date of the grant period: (1) a brief narrative report and evaluation stating what was accomplished with the CCH support; and (2) a final financial report which summarizes all expenditures of CCH grant funds and local matching amounts. The financial report must be based on receipts documenting actual expenditures, as well as signed statements documenting the provision of in-kind goods and services, but these receipts should not be sent to the CCH office; they are to be kept in the office of the project sponsor for a period of three years in case an audit is requested. Only the final narrative report and evaluation and the financial report are to be filed with the CCH.

This requirement also includes the right of the federal government to make an audit of any third party accounts related to the grant.

8. AUDITS

The CCH may inspect and audit Grantee's financial accounts and records, or may designate a qualified person to do so on its behalf, at any time during reasonable business hours and with such frequency as may be deemed necessary. Inspection and audit may include prefunding visits to determine the adequacy of Grantee's accounting system. In addition, the National Endowment for the Humanities and the United States General Accounting Office may conduct inspections and audits when and to the extent deemed advisable.

FINANCIAL RECORDS MUST BE KEPT ON FILE FOR A MINIMUM OF THREE YEARS FOLLOWING THE TERMINATION OF THE GRANT PERIOD. The required retention period may be extended by written notification from either the CCH or the National Endowment for the Humanities.

9. EQUIPMENT AND TITLE TO PROPERTY

The CCH reserves title to equipment purchased with CCH funds. Title to such equipment may, with special written permission from the CCH, be vested in Grantee subject to the conditions that Grantee continues to use the equipment for the purposes of activities in the humanities.

COLLECTION OF INFORMATION 10.

Grantee collects information from the public in connection with a research or other general purpose project on its own initiative. Grantee shall not, without prior approval from the CCH, in any way represent that the information is being collected by or for the CCH or a federal agency.

PRINTING AND DUPLICATING

Grantee shall not use grant funds for printing or duplication of one thousand or more copies of material other than advertising flyers, programs, and similar materials, unless specifically authorized by the grant award letter or other written CCH approval.

PUBLICATION AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF CCH FUNDS

Grantee may publish or produce without charge to grant funds the result of grant activities, provided that such materials (written, visual, or audio) contain an acknowledgement of the support provided by the CCH and the National Endowment for the Humanities. Publications must include in an appropriate place the statement that "the findings, conclusions, and opinions presented herein do not necessarily represent the views of either the California Council for the Humanities or the National Endowment for the Humanities." At least three copies of such publications must be furnished to the CCH unless otherwise specified in the grant award letter.

Any tangible result of grant activity (productions, displays, exhibits, films, etc.) must bear an acknowledgement of support by the California Council for the Humani-

ties and the National Endowment for the Humanities.

Films, tapes, or publications which may be produced as a result of grant activity but after conclusion of the grant will be subject to review by the CCH for determination as to what form of acknowledgement, if any, shall be included.

13. ACCESS BY CCH TO PRODUCED MATERIALS

- a. Grantee understands and agrees that the purpose of all grant activity is to inform and educate members of the public on the broad areas of public concern with which this project was intended to deal. Toward this end, the CCH and Grantee agree to engage in a relationship of good faith and cooperation to ensure that all produced materials will be reasonably available to the CCH.
- b. For the purposes of this Agreement, the term "produced materials" refers to all intellectual property, whether copyrighted or not, including but not limited to productions, displays, exhibits, films, tapes, books, articles, and transcripts which are produced by Grantee or by participants enlisted by Grantee as a result of activity funded under this grant award.
- c. The federal government and the CCH reserve a non-exclusive license to use and reproduce, without payment, any produced materials, including copyrighted material, arising out of grant activities where the government or the CCH deems it in its interest to do so.

This provision is subject, to, modified by, and supplemented by any additional provisions in this Grant Agreement or in the award letter covering use of and rights to all produced materials.

- d. Ownership and copyright of produced materials are held by Grantee subject to all other provisions and conditions governing access by the CCH and the federal government to produced materials included in this Agreement, the grant award letter, and any other applicable written agreement.
- e. If ownership and/or copyright of produced materials is claimed by any person other than Grantee such as a scriptwriter, editor, consultant, filmmaker, author, or lecturer, Grantee agrees to take any action that shall be necessary to ensure that the Council retains all rights that would accrue to the CCH under this Agreement if copyright was fully vested in Grantee. Grantee agrees to conduct its activities in such a manner and to make such agreements with any other persons wishing to copyright produced materials to ensure that the CCH will continue to be able to exercise freely all its rights under the provisions of this Agreement. Grantee's duties will include but not be limited to the duty to obtain assurances from lecturers that the transcripts of their lectures may be used by the CCH in the CCH newsletter, annual report, or for other purposes.

14. INCOME EARNED FROM THE PROJECT

All income earned by Grantee as part of or as a result of the conduct of the grant project shall be accounted for and reported by Grantee to the CCH.

- a. Use of Income. Any income earned from registration fees, service charges or fees, or similar sources during the conduct of the project shall be used by Grantee for activities for the project approved by the CCH. If the income cannot be so used, it shall be paid by Grantee to the CCH for further regranting purposes.
- b. Distribution of Income. Any income earned from the sale, rental, distribution, or other merchandising of produced materials will be distributed as follows:
 - 1) From <u>net income</u>, payment of 50 percent will be made to the CCH and 50 percent to the Grantee. It is agreed that <u>net income</u> will be determined by subtracting the reasonable and ordinary costs of distributing the produced materials from the total gross income derived from the merchandising. No other costs may be deducted from the gross income before income division, such as cost overrun for production of the materials, whether or not such costs were included in the original budget request or grant amount awarded.
 - 2) Income division will remain in effect for a period of five years, beginning on the last day of the grant period, or until the CCH has received repayment of all CCH funds distributed to Grantee, whichever comes first, at which time Grantee will receive 100 percent of the income.

15. TRANSFER OF COPYRIGHT OR OWNERSHIP

In the event that Grantee transfers copyright or ownership of any produced materials for distribution or for any other purpose, Grantee agrees to take any action that shall be necessary to ensure that the CCH shall continue to be able to freely exercise all rights reserved under this Agreement.

If Grantee in transferring copyright or in allowing copyright to vest in any other person fails to fully protect the rights reserved to the CCH and the federal government under this Agreement, then Grantee agrees to indemnify and hold the CCH harmless from any claims, actions, liabilities, losses, or expenses for which the CCH might otherwise be held responsible resulting from infringement in the use of material, invasion of privacy, libel, breach of contract, or third party indebtedness.

16. OTHER AGREEMENTS

The provisions and conditions of this Agreement may be supplemented and modified by special provisions included in the grant award letter. This Agreement is the complete and integrated agreement between the parties only to the extent that no prior or subsequent oral agreement may contradict specific written provisions and is not intended to prevent other written agreements from being made.

17. NON-COMPLIANCE

Grantee and CCH agree that upon non-satisfaction by Grantee of any of the conditions set forth in this Agreement or in the grant award letter, the CCH may at its option: (1) suspend all of its duties under this Agreement, including the duty to pay the grant money; or (2) declare these duties discharged and require Grantee to repay grant money previously awarded; and Grantee agrees to do so.

By signing the copy of the grant award letter, Grantee acknowledges having read and understood all of the provisions and conditions in this Agreement and promises to fully comply with each and all of them.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR CERTIFICATION

- 1. The California Council for the Humanities (CCH) is required to seek from institutional applicants a certification regarding the nondiscrimination statutes and from all applicants the certification regarding debarment and suspension.
- 2. By signing and submitting this proposal, the authorizing official of the applicant institution (sponsoring organization) provides the applicable certifications. When a prospective applicant is unable to provide the CCH with certification regarding the nondiscrimination statutes, the prospective applicant is not eligible to apply for funding from the CCH. When the applicant is unable to provide certification regarding debarment and suspension, the applicant shall attach an explanation to the proposal. The explanation of why the certification on debarment and suspension cannot be submitted will be considered in connection with the CCH funding determination. Failure to furnish a certification or an explanation shall disqualify such person from receiving an award from the CCH.

If it is later determined that the applicant knowingly provided an erroneous certification, in addition to other remedies available to the federal government, the National Endowment for the Humanities may pursue available remedies including suspension and/or debarment.
- 5. The applicant shall provide immediate written notice to the CCH if at any time the applicant learns that its certifications were erroneous when submitted or have become erroneous by reason of changed circumstances.
- 6. The applicant agrees by submitting this proposal that, should the proposal be funded by the CCH, it shall not knowingly enter into any project related transactions (as defined under "lower tier covered transactions") with a person who is debarred, suspended, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this covered transaction, unless authorized by the National Endowment for the Humanities.
- 7. The applicant further agrees by submitting this proposal to include without modification the following clause in all lower tier covered transactions and in all solicitations for lower tier covered transactions:
 - (1) The prospective lower tier participant certifies, by submission of this proposal, that neither it nor its principals is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any federal department or agency.

- (2) Where the prospective lower tier participant is unable to certify to any of the statements in this certification, such prospective participant shall attach an explanation to this proposal.
- 8. A participant in a covered transaction may rely on the certification of a prospective participant in a lower tier covered transaction that it is not debarred, suspended, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from the covered transaction, unless it knows that the certification is erroneous. A participant may decide the method and frequency by which it determines the eligibility of its principals. Each participant may, but is not required to, check the list of "Parties Excluded from Nonprocurement Programs."
- 9. Nothing contained in the foregoing shall be construed to require establishment of a system of records in order to render in good faith the certification required by this clause. The knowledge and information of a participant is not required to exceed that which is normally possessed by a prudent person in the ordinary course of business dealings.
- 10. Except when specifically authorized by the National Endowment for the Humanities, if a participant in a covered transaction knowingly enters into a lower tier covered transaction with a person who is suspended, debarred, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction, in addition to the other remedies available to the federal government, the National Endowment for the Humanities may pursue available remedies, including suspension and/or debarment.
- 11. The following definitions apply to the terms used in each of the certifications.

Definitions

Covered Transactions: A covered transaction is either a primary covered transaction or a lower tier covered transaction.

Debarment: An action taken by a debarring official in accordance with 45 CFR Part 1169 to exclude a person from participating in covered transactions. A person so excluded is "debarred."

Ineligible: Excluded from participation in federal nonprocurement programs pursuant to a determination of ineligibility under statutory, executive order, or regulatory authority, other than Executive Order 12549.

Lower Tier Covered Transaction:

(a) Any transaction between a participant and a person other than a procurement contract for goods or services, regardless of type, under a primary covered transaction.

(b) Any procurement contract for goods or services between a participant and a person, regardless of type, expected to equal or exceed the federal procurement small purchase threshold fixed at 10 U.S.C. 2304(g) and 41 U.S.C. 253(g) (currently \$25,000) under a primary covered transaction.

(c) Any procurement contract for goods or services between a participant and a person under a covered transaction, regardless of amount, under which that person will have a critical influence on or substantive control over that covered transaction. Such persons are project directors, principal investigators, and providers of federally-required audit services.

Participant: Any person who submits a proposal for, enters into, or reasonably may be expected to enter into a covered transaction. This term also includes any person who acts on behalf of or is authorized to commit a participant in a covered transaction as an agent or representative of another participant.

Person: Any individual, corporation, partnership, association, unit of government, or legal entity, however organized, except foreign governments or foreign governmental entities, public international organizations, or foreign government owned or controlled entities.

Primary Covered Transaction: This is normally any nonprocurement transaction between an agency and a person, regardless of type, including grants, cooperative agreements, scholarships, fellowships, contracts of assistance, loans, loan guarantees, subsidies, insurance, payments for specified use, donation agreements, and any other nonprocurement transaction between a federal agency and a person.

<u>Principal</u>: Officer, director, owner, partner, key employee, or other person within a participant with primary management or supervisory responsibilities; or a person who has critical influence on or substantive control over a covered transaction, whether or not employed by the participant.

<u>Proposal</u>: A solicited or unsolicited bid, application, request, invitation to consider, or similar communication by or on behalf of a person seeking to participate or to receive benefit, directly or indirectly, in or under a covered transaction.

Suspension: An action taken by a suspending official in accordance with these regulations that immediately excludes a person from participating in covered transactions for a temporary period, pending completion of an investigation and such legal, debarment, or Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act proceedings as may ensue.

Voluntarily Excluded: The status of nonparticipation or limited participation in covered transactions assumed by a person pursuant to the terms of a settlement.

DISCLOSURE STATEMENTS

Your agency's Conflict of Interest Code designates you as one who must file a disclosure statement with our office each year.

Attached is the 1992-1993 Form 730 (Statement of Economic Interests for Designated Employees) covering the period January 1 through December 31, 1992 which the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) advises is the only form acceptable for filling for 1992. These statement forms are also to be used during the year for filing "assuming, leaving, initial and candidate" statements. A Summary of 1993 Legislative Changes has been included for your information.

Instructions regarding filing Form 730 are included on the form. It is imperative that the cover page be completed (your name as filer, the name of the agency, your position title, mailing address, and your daytime telephone number). The appropriate box (in most cases it will be Annual Statement) must be checked and dated. You must complete the verification at the bottom of the cover page. An unsigned statement is considered an unfiled statement and you may be subject to late filing penalties. Additionally, the schedules on the second page (Summary) must be checked as appropriate and only the completed schedules need be included (sections not applicable should be discarded). Incomplete Information may result in the requirement for a filer to file a Form 730 Amendment.

Keep a copy of your completed form, and transmit the original to your agency/contact person in sufficient time for them to forward it to us prior to the Annual Filing date. Your statement must be received by our office or postmarked by April 1, 1993 (or by your agency's Annual Filing date as specified in their Code). Please note that failure to file statements timely may result in certain criminal and civil penalties, including, but not limited to, late fines (\$10 per day, up to \$100), pursuant to the Government Code Section 91013. There is no provision in the law for an extension of a filing deadline.

SUMMARY OF 1993 LEGISLATIVE CHANGES TO THE CONFLICT OF INTEREST DISCLOSURE PROVISIONS OF THE POLITICAL REFORM ACT

The following amendments to the conflict of interest disclosure provisions of the Political Reform Act have been signed by the Governor and will go into effect January 1, 1993:

<u>Disclosure of Income on Candidates' Statements of Economic</u> Interests

AB 1075 amends Government Code Section 87201 to require candidates for elective offices specified in Government Code Section 87200 to disclose on their statements of economic interests (Form 721) income received during the immediately preceding 12 months. (Chapter 1141, Statutes 1992.)

Assuming Office Statements of Economic Interests for Designated Employees Who Resign


Under the Political Reform Act, designated employees of state and local government agencies are required to file a statement of economic interests (Form 730) within 30 days of assuming office. AB 2941 amends Government Code Section 87302 to provide an exception to this filing requirement if a designated employee resigns from office (1) within 12 months following initial appointment, or (2) within 30 days of the date a notice is mailed by the filing officer of the individual's filing obligation, whichever is earlier. (Chapter 441, Statutes 1992.) Previously, Section 87302 provided that the statement was not required if the designated employee resigned within 45 days of his or her initial appointment.

GIFT LIMITATIONS AND HONORARIA PROHIBITION

Gift Limitations

<u>Elected State Officers</u> may not accept gifts with a value of more than \$250 in a calendar year from a single source.

<u>Local Elected Officers</u> may not accept gifts and honoraria with a value of more than \$1,000 in a calendar year from a single source.

State Board and Commission Members, and State Agency Officials and Designated Employees may not accept gifts with a value of more than \$250 in a calendar year from a single source, if the member or employee would be required to report the receipt of income or gifts from that source on his or her statement of economic interests.

This prohibition does not apply to a part-time member of the governing board of a public institution of higher education, unless the member is also an elected official.

Exceptions To Gift Limit:

The following are not prohibited or limited by the Political Reform Act:

- -- The items listed in "Exceptions From Disclosure" in the instructions for "Completing Schedule F -- Gifts" of this disclosure form.
- -- Payments, advances, or reimbursements for travel and related lodging and subsistence as described in "Travel Payments." However, many payments for travel, lodging and subsistence must be disclosed.
- -- Wedding gifts. However, wedding gifts must be disclosed.

Gifts From Lobbyists: Elected <u>state</u> officers and certain <u>state</u> board and commission members and <u>state</u> agency officials and employees are prohibited from accepting a gift or gifts, including wedding gifts, aggregating more than \$10 in a month from a lobbyist or lobbying firm registered with the Secretary of State.

"Gift" means anything of value, whether tangible or intangible, for which equal or greater value is not provided. You must disclose gifts with an aggregate value of \$50 or more received during the reporting period from a single source, without regard to the location of the donor (inside or outside your jurisdiction). Any number of gifts from one person, the values of which add up to \$50 or more during the reporting period, must be disclosed.

Honoraria Prohibition

<u>Elected State Officers</u> may not accept any honorarium. "Honorarium" means, with the exceptions noted below, any payment made in consideration for any speech given, article published, or attendance at any public or private conference, convention, meeting, social event, meal, or like gathering.

<u>Local Elected Officers</u> may not accept honoraria for any speech given, article published, or attendance at any public or private conference, convention, meeting, social event, meal, or like gathering, or gifts which aggregate more than \$1,000 from a single source in a calendar year.

Members of State Boards and Commissions, and Employees of State Agencies may not accept an honorarium from any source, if the member or employee would be required to report the receipt of income or gifts from that source on his or her statement of economic interests.

This prohibition does not apply to any part-time member of the governing board of any public institution of higher education unless the member is also an elected official.

Exceptions To Honoraria Prohibition:

- 1. "Honorarium" does not include earned income for personal services which are customarily provided in connection with the practice of a bona fide business, trade, or profession, such as teaching, practicing law, medicine, insurance, real estate, banking, or building contracting, unless the sole or predominant activity of the business, trade, or profession is making speeches.
- 2. This prohibition does not apply to payments, advances, and reimbursements for travel and related lodging and subsistence, as described in "Travel Payments" below.
- 3. This prohibition does not apply to any honorarium which is not used and, within 30 days after receipt, is either returned to the donor or delivered to the Controller for donation to the General Fund, without being claimed as a deduction from income for tax purposes.

Travel Payments

With the following exceptions, payments and reimbursements for travel are subject to the gift limitations set out above:

Payments, advances, or reimbursements for travel, including actual transportation and related lodging and subsistence which is reasonably related to a legislative or governmental purpose, or to an issue of state, national, or international public policy, are not prohibited or limited, if either of the following apply:

- (1) The travel is in connection with a speech given by the elected officer or state employee, the lodging and subsistence expenses are limited to the day immediately preceding, the day of, and the day immediately following the speech, and the travel is within the United States.
- (2) The travel is provided by a government, a governmental agency, a foreign government, a governmental authority, a bona fide public or private educational institution, as defined in Section 203 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, or a nonprofit charitable or religious organization which is exempt from taxation under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or by a person domiciled outside the United States which substantially satisfies the requirements for tax exempt status under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- (3) Travel costs paid from campaign funds as permitted by Government Code Section 89510, $\underline{\text{et}}$ $\underline{\text{seq}}$.
- (4) Travel provided by the agency of an elected officer, member of a state board or commission, or designated employee of a state agency.
- (5) Travel which is reasonably necessary in connection with a bona fide business, trade, or profession and which satisfies the criteria for federal income tax deduction for business expenses in Sections 162 and 174 of the Internal Revenue Code, unless the sole or predominant activity of the business, trade, or profession is making speeches.
- (6) Travel which is excluded from the definition of a gift by any other provision of the Political Reform Act.

NOTE: Although certain travel payments are not prohibited or limited, they may have to be disclosed. Refer to the instructions for completing Schedule D-1: for detailed information.

TYPES OF STATEMENTS AND WHEN STATEMENTS MUST BE FILED

FAILURE TO FILE STATEMENTS ON TIME MAY RESULT IN PENALTIES INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO LATE FINES.

Assuming Office Statement:

File if you assume a position designated in your agency's conflict of interest code.

- a. Positions subject to State Senate confirmation -- File no later than 30 days after your appointment or nomination by the Governor.
- b. All other positions -- File no later than 30 days after you assume office.

Annual Statement:

File at the time prescribed in your agency's conflict of interest code (April 1 for most filers).

Leaving Office Statement:

File no later than 30 days after you leave your designated position.

Initial Statement:

If your agency has a <u>newly-adopted</u> conflict of interest code, file no later than 30 days after the effective date of your agency's conflict of interest code. If your position was <u>newly</u> designated in your agency's conflict of interest code, file no later than 30 days after the effective date of the amendment to the code.

Candidate Statement:

File no later than the final filing deadline for your declaration of candidacy. (Candidates for elective offices not specified in Gov. Code Section 87200 must file a "candidate" statement (Form 730) only if required by the agency's conflict of interest code.)

WHERE MUST STATEMENTS BE FILED?

All statements, except those filed by State Assembly and Senate staff members, are filed with your own agency, board or commission unless otherwise specified in your agency's conflict of interest code.

State Assembly and Senate staff members file their statements directly with the Fair Political Practices Commission.

You must file an originally signed statement of economic interests with each agency, board or commission with which you hold a designated position covered by a conflict of interest code.

Reporting Interests in Rental Property and Income from Rental Property

If you or your immediate family have an interest in a rental property directly, i.e., not through a business entity, you must report:

Your share of the total amount of rental income received from the property on Schedule D; and

• If your ownership interest is 10% or greater, the name of any tenant who paid rent of which your share was \$10,000 or more on Schedule H-3.

If you or your immediate family own a 10% or greater interest in a business entity, such as a partnership or joint venture, which owns real property, you must report:

The business entity on Schedule A;

The property held by the business entity on Schedule C-1;

Your share of the total amount of income, including rents, received from the business entity on Schedule D;

• The name of any client or customer who provided income to the business entity of which your pro rata share was \$10,000 or more on Schedule H-2.

*An interest in a lease on real property is reportable if the value of the leasehold interest is \$1,000 or more. The value of the leasehold interest is the total amount of rent owed by you during the reporting period, or on an assuming office statement, during the prior 12 months. No leasehold interest with a value of less than \$1,000 need be reported. Reporting Assets Held By A Trust: You must disclose interests in real property held by any trust in which you have a 10% or greater interest, if your pro rata share of the interest in real property is \$1,000 or more. Pursuant to FPPC Regulation 18234, you have an interest in a trust if you are:

- 1. A maker and:
 - a. can revoke or terminate the trust; or
 - b. have retained any rights to the income or principal of the trust or retained any reversionary or remainder interest; or
 - c. have retained any power of appointment including the power to change the beneficiaries.
- 2. A beneficiary and:
 - a. presently receive income; or
 - b. have an irrevocable future right to receive income or principal.

If you are only a trustee, you do not have a reportable interest in the trust.

If, during the reporting period, the business entity or trust held investments:

You must report such investments if your pro rata share of any investment is \$1,000 or more and the investment is in a business entity located in, or doing business in, your jurisdiction (report this on Schedule C-2).

In addition, you must report the business entity holding such investments as an investment on Schedule A.

Reporting Assets Held By A Trust: You must disclose investments and interests in real property held by any trust in which you have a 10% or greater interest, if your pro rata share of the investment or interest in real property is \$1,000 or more. Pursuant to FPPC Regulation 18234, you have an interest in a trust if you are:

- 1. A maker and:
 - a. can revoke or terminate the trust; or
 - b. have retained any rights to the income or principal of the trust or retained any reversionary or remainder interest; or
 - c. have retained any power of appointment including the power to change the beneficiaries.
- 2. A beneficiary and:
 - a. presently receive income; or
 - b. have an irrevocable future right to receive income or principal.

If you are only a trustee, you do not have a reportable interest in the trust.

EXAMPLE, SCHEDULE C-2

• ABC Land Developers owns common stock worth \$3,000 in Ajax Building Materials, which does business in your jurisdiction. The investment was not acquired or disposed of during the reporting period.

OF INTEREST CODE TO DETERMINE THE TYPES OF INCOME YOU MUST DISCLOSE.

Important: Under the Political Reform Act, reportable income is different from income for tax purposes.

You must report your gross income and your community property interest in your spouse's gross income. Gross income is the total amount of income before deducting expenses, losses or taxes. Income aggregating \$250 or more received from any source located in or doing business in your jurisdiction must be disclosed.

A source of income is located in or doing business in the jurisdiction if it or a parent, subsidiary, or a related business entity:

- Manufactures, distributes, sells or purchases products or services on a regular basis in the jurisdiction.
- Plans to do business in the jurisdiction.
- Has done business in the jurisdiction within the previous two years.
- Has an interest in real property in the jurisdiction. Has an office in the jurisdiction.

Reportable income includes:

- Commission income. (See Schedule H-1-Commission Income.)
- Salary/wages, per diem, reimbursement for expenses. (See exclusions below. Also see Schedule D-1-Income -- Travel Payments, Advances, Reimbursements.)
- Income from a business entity and your pro rata share of the total gross payments received by a business entity (including rental property) or a trust in which you or your spouse had an ownership interest of 10% or more.
- Your community property interest (50%) in your spouse's income.
- Proceeds from any sale, including the sale of a house or car. (The total sale price is reportable regardless of any obligation you might have to pay on loans secured by the property.)
- Rental income.
- Prizes or awards not disclosed as gifts.
- Forgiveness of a loan or other indebtedness.
- Loan payments received by you.

You are not required to disclose the following types of income:

- Salary or reimbursements for expenses and per diem from a federal, state or local government agency.
- Reimbursement for travel expenses and per diem received from a bona fide educational, academic or charitable organization.
- Campaign contributions.
- A devise or inheritance. (However, inheritance of an investment or an interest in real property may be required to be reported on Schedule A or B.)

 Dividends, interest or other return on a security which is registered with the Securities and Exchange.
- Payments received under an insurance policy.
- interest, dividends or premiums on a time or demand deposit in a financial institution, shares in a credit union, an insurance policy, or a bond or other debt instrument issued by a government agency.
- Income of dependent children. Payments received under a defined benefit pension plan qualified under Internal Revenue Code Section 401(a).

Schedule D-1 is for disclosing payments, advances, or reimbursements for travel, including actual transportation and related lodging and subsistence.*

In addition to disclosing the source, date, amount, and purpose of the payment, check the box to indicate if the payment was a gift or income. To determine if travel payments are gifts or income:

- Travel payments are gifts if you did not provide services which were equal to or greater in value than the payments received. You must disclose gifts aggregating \$50 or more from a single source during the period covered by the statement.
- Travel payments are income if you provided services which were equal to or greater in value than the
 payments received. You must disclose income aggregating \$250 or more from a single source during the
 period covered by the statement.

Gov. Code Section 82028 provides that any person, other than a defendant in a criminal action, who claims that a payment is not a gift by reason of receipt of consideration has the burden of proving that the consideration received is of equal or greater value.

You are not required to disclose the following types of travel payments:

- Payment or reimbursement for transportation within California in connection with an event at which you
 gave a speech, participated in a panel or seminar or performed a similar service.
- Food, beverages, and necessary accommodations received directly in connection with an event held inside or outside California at which you gave a speech, participated in a panel, or provided a similar service.
- Travel payments received from your government agency, or from any state, local, or federal government
 agency for which you provided equal or greater consideration for the payments received.
- Travel payments received from a bona fide educational, academic, or charitable organization for which you provided equal or greater consideration for the payments received.

- Any indebtedness created as part of a retail installment or credit card transaction made in the creditor's regular course of business on terms available to the public without regard to official status if the aggregate amount owed to the creditor did not exceed \$10,000 at any time during the reporting period.
- Any loan from your spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, parent-in-law, brother-inlaw, sister-in-law, nephew, niece, aunt, uncle, or first cousin or the spouse of any such person, except that a loan from any such person is reportable if the person is acting as an intermediary or agent for any person not covered by this provision.

INFORMATION FOR COMPLETING SCHEDULE F - Income -- Gifts

BEFORE COMPLETING THIS SCHEDULE, CONSULT YOUR AGENCY'S CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE TO DETERMINE THE TYPES OF INCOME YOU MUST DISCLOSE.

"Gift" means anything of value, whether tangible or intangible, for which equal or greater value is not provided. You must disclose gifts with an aggregate value of \$50 or more received during the reporting period from a single source, without regard to the location of the donor (inside or outside your jurisdiction). Any number of gifts from one person, the values of which add up to \$50 or more during the reporting period, must be disclosed.

It is the acceptance of the gift, and not the ultimate use to which it is put, that imposes a reporting obligation on you. Thus, you must report a gift even if you never make use of it (unless you return the gift or donate it to a charity) or if you give it away to another person. (Note: There are special rules for reporting gifts of free passes or tickets. (Commission Regulation 18946.1.)) If the exact amount of the gift is not known, you must make a good faith estimate of the item's fair market value. Listing the value of the gift as "over \$50" or "value unknown" is not adequate disclosure. Gifts are reportable without regard to where the donor is located.

See Schedule D-1- Income — Travel Payments, Advances, Reimbursements for information concerning payments, including advances and reimbursements, for travel.

<u>IMPORTANT:</u> If you receive a gift through an intermediary, you must disclose the name, address and business activity of both the donor and the intermediary.

You are <u>not</u> required to disclose the following types of gifts:

- Gifts of hospitality involving food, drink or occasional lodging provided in an individual's home.
- Gifts equal in value exchanged between you and an individual, other than a lobbyist, on holidays, birthdays, or similar occasions.
- Gifts of informational material provided to assist you in the performance of your official duties, such as books, pamphlets, reports, calendars or periodicals.
- Gifts from your spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, parent-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, aunt, uncle, niece, nephew, or first cousin or the spouse of any such person, provided that a gift from any such person must be disclosed if the person is acting as an agent or intermediary for a reportable source of income.
- A bequest or inheritance. (However, an inheritance of an investment or an interest in real property may be required to be reported on Schedule A or B.)
- Gifts which are not used and which, within 30 days after receipt, are returned to the donor or delivered to a
 charitable organization without being claimed as a charitable contribution for tax purposes.
- Personalized plaques and trophies with an individual value of less than \$250.
- Campaign contributions.
- Food, beverage, and necessary accommodations received directly in connection with an event at which you gave a speech, participated in a panel, or provided a similar service.
