In *The Stranger* by French author and philosopher Albert Camus, we follow Mersault, a French Algerian shopping clerk and the proceedings of his life after his mother's death. The whole story revolves around Mersault in how he evolves and changes as the story progresses. Many would describe Mersault as passionless, ambitionless, and disaffected as he fails to show any sort of emotion throughout the novel. As an atheist Mersault is constantly isolated from society due to the way he thinks and behaves. As the story progresses, we learn that Mersault is very easily pleased by certain pleasant sensations and is very easily displeased by certain unpleasant sensations.
