

Andrew shared, "As a current Cal State Long Beach student, I signed up to volunteer as a tutor to give back to my community and improve my tutoring skills. I was quite nervous initially since my only experience had been tutoring immediate family and friends. Still, the staff here at the Placentia Library have been kind, welcoming, and highly supportive in my journey thus far. It was not until meeting my learner that I realized just how hardworking someone can be, and I am always grateful for the passion, dedication, and attentiveness that my learner brings with them every day. I have seen immense progress quickly and look forward to many fruitful sessions."

Hodder shared, "Before I came to the library, I was only able to understand a few words when I listened to someone speak English. After learning about the sounds, vocabulary, and reading, I feel like I

am progressing little by little every day. I feel like I am learning new words that I have never seen before. I have learned things that I can apply to my work, such as naming objects like pots and pans. I am also very happy because I was able to apply introductory phrases at work when meeting someone new. I appreciate my tutor as he always considers how I feel when it comes to the lessons and pace. I am grateful to my tutor and the Literacy Staff for my progress. I look forward to learning more from everyone. Thank you."



Donna and Youni

Donna and Youni have been working together since July 2023.

Donna shared, "I have enjoyed volunteering with the Placentia Library Literacy Program for over six years. It has been a rewarding experience helping others learn English and improve their literacy skills. Youni has worked hard to achieve several goals this year. Her vocabulary has increased, she has more confidence speaking to others, and she most recently passed the written test to acquire a driver's license. Youni and I both like a good mystery, so every week we discuss a book we are reading and try to figure out "who done it"."

Youni shared, "I used to live in Korea but now I live in America because I married an American. I used to think my English skills were good enough until I moved here a year ago. It is hard to understand when Americans speak because they speak so fast. But after having class with Donna, I can understand what people say, and I can talk to others. I have also learned how to explain symptoms to my doctor or CVS Pharmacy when I am sick. I really like writing in my journal and sharing with Donna the things that happened over the week."





How can I get a Placentia Library card?

Apply for a library card in-person at the library!

Placentia Library District will issue a library card to California residents with a valid driver's license, or U.S. government issued photo identification.

- Accompanying proof of a current California address issued to the applicant within the last six (6) months is required
- Consular ID's, Out of State ID, or U.S. Passports may be used for identification along with current proof of address such as utility bills.
- Patrons under the age of 18 must be accompanied by one parent. The accompanying parent must present ID and current proof of address.














Quiet Nook
